Rev Paul Worledge welcomed everyone to the meeting and started the meeting in prayer. He quoted from Psalm 46:10 – 'Be still and know that I am God'.

1. Apologies for absence

2. Minutes of the APCM of 22nd May 2022

The minutes were accepted as a correct record of the Annual Parochial Meeting.

3. Matters arising

There were none.

4. Annual Reports (official reports)

The Annual Report (AR) pack was sent to members beforehand and was also placed on St Luke's website. At the meeting, the content of the report was taken as read. All sections of these minutes will reference the relevant sections of the Annual Report (AR), where full details are to be found.

4i Electoral Roll Report (AR 5.1, page 8)

During 2022, 14 people were removed from the Electoral Register and 15 people were added. It now means that there is a total of 100 people on the register. There were 99 people on the register at the end of 2021. Of those on the register 33 live in the parish (36 in 2021).

4ii Church Fabric (AR 5.6, page 10)

The Church fabric report gave a brief synopsis of some of the works carried out during the year. The sudden death of our maintenance worker (Chris Tull) had meant that plans for the year were somewhat curtailed.

The main items in the Fabric Report for the year were:

- The sudden passing of Chris Tull, our maintenance and Gardening worker.
- The Eco-Church award and the departure of Christoper Waldie, Church warden and lead on buildings matters.
- The review of the Health & Safety Policies by the newly formed Building Team.
- The Quinquennial Inspection and subsequent report.

4iii Deanery Synod Report (AR 5.7, page 11)

The Synod Report highlighted the interest in rural affairs. In particular, the plight of farmers. There was also a mention of the Deanery Roadshow that included a presentation by the Archdeacon and Bishop on the Diocese finance and its possible impact on each Parish in the year.

4iv Finance Report – including approval of Accounts (7. AR page 16-28)

The annual accounts were approved by members.

Special thanks were extended to Nicky Galer for all the work that she does in keeping the church's finance in order and for compiling the annual accounts.

For the year 1st January 2022-31 December 2022, general fund receipt was £86,206 and spend against that receipt was £69,857. This leaves a positive balance of £16,349 before the offset of a small deficit of (£113) and a transfer of (£6661) to reserves. Leaving a balance carried forward of £9573. This was an exceptional occurrence for St Luke's. However, the surplus carried forward was brought about by a grant of £10,000 received from Diocese at the start of the year towards the Parish Share.
